LATEUM TODAY:

(The Linguistic Association of Teachers of English at the University of Moscow) is the first linguistic association of teachers of English in Russia that was set up as a professional organisation to provide a new line of cooperation between teachers of English (and Russian) both inside the country and on a world-wide international scale.

It is now for the second decade that LATEUM has been directly involved in a very wide range of programmes of both academic and educational orientation reaching far beyond its primary concern – theory and practice of ELT. As has been pointed out from the very start, LATEUM members should not necessarily be the Lomonosov Moscow State University teachers only: membership is open to English / Russian philologists at other universities and training colleges world-wide. Thus the aims and objectives of the Association are:

- to update and strengthen instruction and research at all levels of English Language Teaching;
- to establish and maintain contacts with linguistic associations worldwide:
- to collect and spread useful information about new developments in teaching English as a foreign language;
- to provide opportunities for the discussion of professionally relevant issues by holding regular bi-annual conferences and publishing the newsletter of LATEUM.

LATEUM today is an Associate of IATEFL and a member organisation of FIPLV (Federation Internationale des Professeurs de Langues Vivantes). European Book Company, Dinternal, Macmillan, Oxford University Press, Pearson Education, Relod et al.).
