

## Сценарий внеклассного мероприятия по английскому языку “Little Elephant Goes to School”

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Вашему вниманию предлагается сценарий спектакля, который был успешно использован во время внеклассных мероприятий в школе № 315 г. Москвы. В этой школе учащиеся младших классов на протяжении многих лет изучают английский язык по УМК “Enjoy English–1” и “Enjoy English–2”. В конце учебного года выпускники начальной школы показывают веселые спектакли для своих родителей, учеников и учителей школы. Сценарии этих необычных спектаклей придумывает учитель английского языка Людмила Анатольевна Досик. На протяжении многих лет Людмила Анатольевна тесно сотрудничает с авторами курса “Enjoy English”, проявляя творческий подход к совместной работе. Ее уроки отличаются высоким уровнем мотивации учащихся, поскольку Людмила Анатольевна использует разнообразные приемы и формы работы, позволяющие вовлечь учащихся в процесс общения на английском языке. Участие детей в театральном проекте, который заканчивается постановкой музыкального спектакля, является одним из действенных способов

организации речевого взаимодействия на уроках английского языка в четвертом классе. Несколько лет назад уроки английского языка, которые проводит Л. А. Досик, были сняты на видео и в настоящее время используются в качестве методического пособия при подготовке учителей английского языка в Московском городском педагогическом университете.

Предлагаемый сценарий предназначен для учащихся 4-х классов. Он полностью построен на материале курса “Enjoy English–2”. Главное действующее лицо – слоненок Томас, с которым дети познакомились на страницах учебника “Enjoy English–2” (сказка “Baby Elephant and His New Things”). Набор реплик героев, стихи, рифмовки, песенки, используемые в сценарии, – все взято из курса и изучено детьми на уроках английского языка. Подготовка к спектаклю не потребует много времени, достаточно будет двух-трех репетиций для того, чтобы учащиеся смогли представить сказку на сцене.

Participants: Storyteller, Mother Elephant, Baby Elephant, Mr Marmot, Mrs Wolf, Mr Cat, 10 mice.

### Scene 1

*There is a nice room on the stage. There is a bed, a table and some chairs in the room.*

Storyteller: There lives a little Baby Elephant and his mother. He is good and clever. And he wants to learn and go to school.

Baby Elephant

(*staying in bed*): Mummy, I'd like to learn and go to school.

Mother Elephant: Why don't you sleep? Close your eyes! It's time to sleep. Good night, sleep tight.

Baby Elephant

(*jumping out of bed*): Good night, Mummy! Mum, I don't want to sleep. I want to go to school.

Mother Elephant: Oh, dear, close your eyes. I'll tell you a nice fairy tale.

Baby Elephant: Mum, I don't want any fairy tale. I want to learn and go to school.

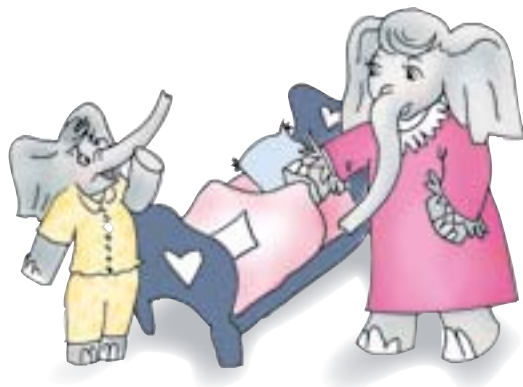
Mother Elephant: Do you want a sweet?

Baby Elephant: Mum, I don't want any sweet. I want to go to school.

Mother Elephant: Oh, dear, would you like a cake?

Baby Elephant

(*going to bed*): No, Mum, thank you. I want to learn.



## Scene 2

*Morning. There is a nice room on the stage. There is a bed and a table in the room. There are different vegetables and fruit on the table. There is Mother Elephant and Baby Elephant in the room.*

- Mother Elephant: Good morning, dear! It's time to get up!
- Baby Elephant: Good morning, Mummy! *(Baby Elephant jumps out of bed, dresses and washes his face.)*
- Mother Elephant: Sh! Listen, there is somebody at the door. Oh, this is Mrs Wolf. How are you Mrs Wolf?
- Mrs Wolf: I'm fine, thank you. I hope you are, too.
- Mother Elephant: Come in. Sit down, please.
- Mrs Wolf: You see, I walked in the forest. Today the weather is fine. It's warm and sunny. But I was tired. I saw your house and decided to visit you.
- Mother Elephant: Would you like to have breakfast with us? We have tasty porridge, cabbage and carrots, apples and bananas for breakfast. Help yourself!
- Mrs Wolf: No, thank you. I'm not hungry. May I have a cup of tea?
- Mother Elephant: Here you are.
- Mrs Wolf: Thank you. How are you, Baby Elephant? Why are you so sad?
- Mother Elephant: You see, Mrs Wolf, my Baby Elephant wants to learn and go to school. But there are schools for elephants only in Africa. There are no schools for elephants in our forest.
- Mrs Wolf: Well, I think, I can help you. There is a good school for rabbits near your house.
- Mother Elephant: But they don't take elephants there. Rabbits are afraid of elephants.
- Mrs Wolf: And what about birds' school?
- Mother Elephant: But it's in the tree! And besides the birds are so merry and funny. They like to sing and chatter. And Baby Elephant is so shy. I am afraid he can't study there.
- Mrs Wolf: Well, then there is a nice school for bears near the old tree.
- Mother Elephant: Yes, a nice school. But bears sleep in winter.
- Baby Elephant *(sadly)*: I don't want to sleep. I want to learn.
- Mother Elephant: Oh, I don't know what to do. Is there a school for my little son?
- Mrs Wolf: Yes, there is. There is a school for mice. They take any children: big and small, fat and slim, tall and short, serious and merry, brave and shy.
- Mother Elephant: Really? Very good. Thank you.
- Baby Elephant: Oh, let's go there now.
- Mother Elephant: OK. Put on your new coat and hat. We'll go to school in a minute. Goodbye, Mrs Wolf!
- Mrs Elephant: Good luck! Bye!

*Baby Elephant and his Mother Elephant are walking to school. Baby Elephant is reciting the poem:*

There is a house in the wood,  
In the wood, in the wood,  
How nice and how good,  
How good, how good.  
It's not tall, it's not small  
It's good for all.



### Scene 3

*There is a classroom in the school for mice. There is a blackboard, maps, desks and chairs in the classroom. There are mice (the pupils), a marmot (their teacher) and Storyteller in the classroom.*

Storyteller: This is a school for mice. There are big doors and small windows in the school. Let us come inside. This is a music lesson.

*Mr Marmot is giving a music lesson. His pupils (mice) are sitting at the desks.*

Mr Marmot: Let's learn a merry song.

*Mr Marmot and his mice (singing and dancing):*

Clap, clap, clap your hands,  
Clap your hands together,  
Stamp, stamp, stamp your feet,  
Stamp your feet together.

Touch, touch, touch your ears  
Touch your ears together,  
Touch, touch, touch your cheeks,  
Touch your cheeks together.

Shake, shake, shake your hands,  
Shake your hands together,  
Smile, smile, at your friends,  
Let us smile together.



*A knock at the door.*

Mouse 1: Oh, that is he!

Mouse 2: This is a Cat! Oh! Oh!

Mouse 3: Oh, Oh! Help! Help!

Mouse 4: He is bad! He will chase us!

Mouse 5: He is strong! He will take us!

Mouse 6: He is hungry! He will eat us!

Mouse 7: He is angry! I am afraid of him!

Mouse 8: I don't like cunning cats!

Mouse 9: Oh, I don't like big and fat cats!

Mouse 10: I'm afraid of ugly cats! Help! Help!

Mr Marmot: Just a moment! Little mice, be quiet! Don't be afraid! I'll speak to him. I'm not afraid of cats.

*Mother Elephant comes into the classroom. Baby Elephant is behind the screen.*

Mother Elephant: Good morning, dear teacher and pupils!

Mr Marmot: Good morning, Mrs Elephant!

Mouse 10: Good morning, Mrs Elephant!

Mother Elephant: Excuse me, ...I am very sorry. But my little son wants to learn. He wants to go to school. He is already six. He is so clever and so hardworking and so nice.

Mr Marmot: Well, we'll see. I would like to ask him some questions. Where is your son?

Mother Elephant: Come in, dear. Here he is.

Baby Elephant: Good morning! I am Baby Elephant. I want to learn.

Mr Marmot: Oh, you are so big! ... Good morning!

Mother Elephant: You are right. He is big, ...though he is little.

Baby Elephant

*(looking at the mice):* Oh, you are little elephants!

Mr Marmot: You are not right! They are not elephants! They are boy mice and girl mice. And they are pupils.

Mother Elephant: What nice little pupils! And they can read books.  
Mr Marmot: Sit down, Baby Elephant. Be careful! Don't sit on your classmates. Well, are you ready?

Baby Elephant  
(*sitting at the desk and smiling*): Yes, I am.

Mr Marmot  
(*smiling*): What's your name?

Baby Elephant  
(*at a loss*): I don't know.

Mr Marmot  
(*smiling*): Where do you live?

Baby Elephant  
(*at a loss*): I don't know.

Mr Marmot  
(*in surprise*): Well, how old are you?

Baby Elephant  
(*at a loss*): I don't know.

Mr Marmot  
(*in surprise*): Hm, what do you like to eat for dinner?

Baby Elephant  
(*at a loss, looking at his mother*): I don't know.

Mother Elephant: Oh, he knows, knows. I'll ask him. My dear, what do you eat for dinner? Pota...

Baby Elephant  
(*smiling*): Potatoes.

Mother Elephant: That's right! And what else? App...

Baby Elephant  
(*smiling*): Apples.

Mother Elephant: Very good! And ju...

Baby Elephant  
(*smiling*): And juice.

Mother Elephant: With a ca...

Baby Elephant  
(*laughing*): With a cake!

Mother Elephant: Very well! You see my son is very clever and he knows a lot of things.

Mr Marmot: Yes, of course, I see he is rather clever. Can you read and write?

Baby Elephant: No, I can't.

Mr Marmot: Can you count? Two plus three is...

Baby Elephant  
(*proudly*): Yes, I can. Two plus three is seven.

Mr Marmot: Well, Mrs Elephant, let's go and speak to our Headteacher.

Mouse 1 (*looking at Baby Elephant*): Oh, he is so big and he can't read.

Mouse 2 (*sadly*): He is so fat and can't write.

Mouse 3  
(*thoughtfully*): Perhaps he is lazy!

Mouse 4  
(*addressing*

*Baby Elephant*): Shame on you, shame on you!

Mouse 5: He is certainly a big boy! Certainly!

Mouse 6: He isn't clever, he can't count.



Mouse 7: Oh, he is stupid. I am sure he is stupid.

Mouse 8

(*laughing*): He is as tall as a tree.

Mouse 9: He is as big as a house.

Mouse 10: Shame on you, shame on you!

Storyteller: And Baby Elephant begins to cry!

Baby Elephant

(*crying*): Oh, I am so unhappy. I am stupid. I can't learn at school.

Mouse 1: Stop crying! Stop, please!

Mouse 2: We are all wet!

Mouse 3: Oh, my books and workbooks! They are wet.

Mouse 4: Let us make him laugh!

*Mice begin tickling Baby Elephant. Baby Elephant stops crying. He begins smiling, then laughing. And all the mice begin to laugh too. But suddenly somebody knocks at the door.*

Mr Cat

(*irritatingly*): Mew-mew, mew-mew! You are so noisy. I am tired of you. I can't sleep. I'll eat you for breakfast.

Mouse 5: Oh, a hungry cat! He'll eat us.

Mouses 6, 7

(*crying*): We want to go to our mothers! We are afraid of cats.

Baby Elephant

(*smiling*): What fun! Little mice, why are you afraid of the cat? He is so small.

Mouse 8: I think Baby Elephant is brave and strong.

Mouse 9: Yes, he is not a coward. He can help us.

Mouse 10: Baby Elephant! Help us, please. Chase the angry cat out of the school!

Baby Elephant: Go away! Go away, the ugly cat! I am not afraid of you!

Mouse 10: Go away! Go away! We are not afraid of you!

Mr Cat

(*running away*): OK. Don't shout! I am very busy. I have no time to speak to you, dear mice and Baby Elephant. I must visit Mrs Wolf. Goodbye!

Baby Elephant: Mr Cat is bad and cunning. But he is not brave. He won't come back.

Mouse 1: Baby Elephant is brave! He is not afraid of cats!

Mouse 2: He is strong! Mr Cat is afraid of him.

Mouse 3: He will study in our class. We'll be friends.

Mouse 4: He is nice and merry! We'll play together!

Mouse 5: He is kind and clever! We'll study together!

Mouse 6: We'll help you to study. Sit down, please!

Mouse 7: Let's begin our lesson.

Mouse 8: Look at these letters! They are A and B.

Baby Elephant: A, B.

Mouse 9: Very good! Now stand up, please. Go to the blackboard and take the chalk.

Baby Elephant: Is this a chalk? Hm! (Baby Elephant puts the chalk\* in his mouth and eats it.)

Mouse 10: Why have you eaten the chalk?  
 Baby Elephant: I think it's as sweet and tasty as sugar.  
 Mouse 10: Oh, you mustn't eat the chalk, you must write with it.  
 Mouse 7: We can't write now. Let's sing the ABC.

*Mice begin singing the song, Baby Elephant helps them:*

A, B, C, D, E, F, G,  
 H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, P,  
 Q, R, S, T, U, V, W,  
 X, Y, Z. Oh, well you see,  
 Now we know the ABC.

Mouse 6: Now, Baby Elephant, name  
 the letters (showing different  
 letters).

Baby Elephant: A, E, I.

Mouse 5: Excellent!

Baby Elephant: O, U.

Mice: Fine! It's great! Well done!  
 Very good! Good for you!

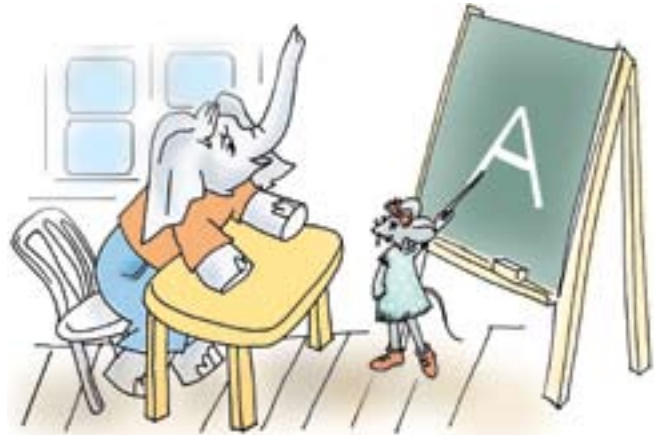
Mouse 4: Now let's count together.

Mice and Baby

Elephant *(together)*: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 – 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1.

Storyteller: Now Baby Elephant and the mice are friends. They learn and  
 play together.

Baby Elephant, Mice, Mr Marmot, Mrs Elephant, Mrs Wolf, Mr Cat *(They sing  
 together)*:



The more we are together,  
 Together, together,  
 The more we are together,  
 The happier we are.  
 For my friend is your friend  
 And you friend is my friend.  
 The more we are together,  
 The happier we are.

The more we sing together,  
 Together, together,  
 The more we sing together,  
 The merrier we are.  
 For his friends are her friends  
 And her friends are his friends.  
 The more we sing together,  
 The happier we are.

The more we dance together,  
 Together, together,  
 The more we dance together,  
 The happier we are.  
 For our friends are their friends  
 And their friends are our friends.  
 The more we dance together,  
 The happier we are.
