Методическая разработка для 10-11-х классов

Цели урока:

- 1. Развивать речевую компетенцию учащихся, совершенствуя монологическую и диалогическую речь.
- 2. Совершенствовать языковую компетенцию учащихся.
- 3. Познакомить учащихся с легендами об Урале.

Задачи:

- 1. Расширить активный лексический запас учащихся за счет включения выражений согласия / несогласия, адекватных ситуаций общения; выражения собственного мнения; включения прилагательных, описывающих персонажей и т. д.
- 2. Научить высказывать собственное мнение, комбинировать речевые единицы для осуществления продуктивных речевых действий.

Ход урока:

I. Lead-in

Brainstorm

Do you know any authors whose literary works were devoted to the rendering of the famous legends about Ural? Have you ever read any of these legends? Name them.

II. Survey

Which of these legends do you think have made you interested in the history of Ural and Chelyabinsk region? Why have they impressed you so much?

- III. Reading the summary of the legend "Kalima and Guryan" written by Nikolai Tsibizov.
 - 1. Read the first part of the story and put the verbs in brackets in the correct tense: the past simple, the past continuous or the past perfect.
